

Share of Total Use






CIRCULATION

Overall circulation in 2016 decreased, with significant increases in the use of e-content. The decrease in physical circulation was driven by declines in the use of multilingual and audio-visual materials.









TPL saw increases to its overall visits, with steady increases in virtual visits and stable in-branch visits over 2015.











Increased use reflects Torontonians' need for access to computers, software and bandwidth for success in school, work, and lifelong learning.




