- Impressed with the Middle Childhood Framework and how it reflected their publishing philosophy

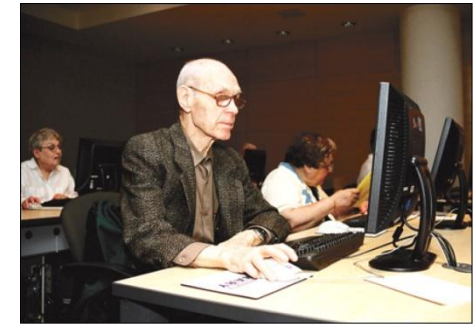

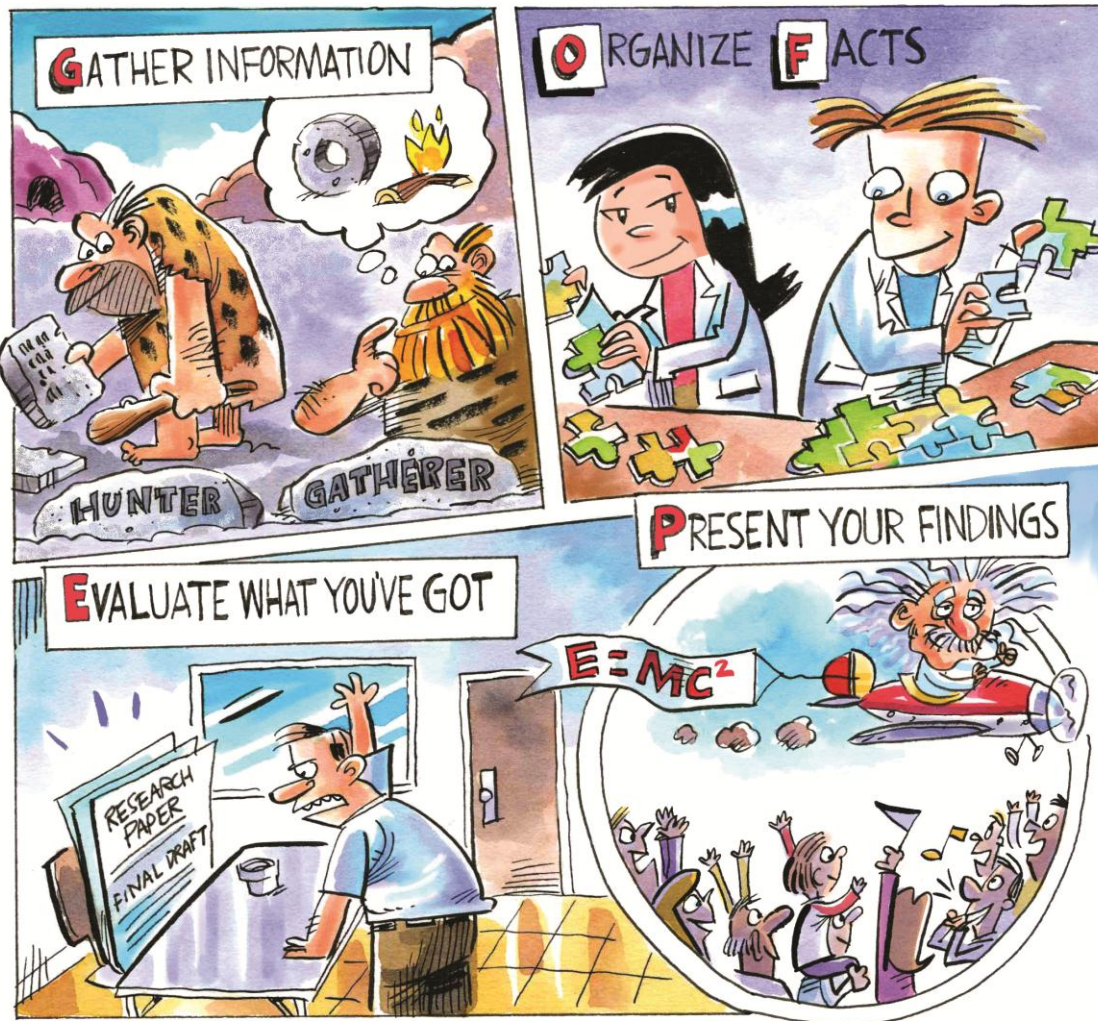


Calling all superheroes ...
