Dear Minister Vernile:

On behalf of the staff and Board of the Toronto Public Library, please accept our congratulations on your appointment as Minister, Tourism, Culture and Sport. We look forward to working with you on advancing public libraries in the future.

By way of introduction, Toronto Public Library is the largest public library system in Canada with a network of 100 branches across Toronto consisting of 81 neighbourhood branches, 17 district branches and two research and reference facilities. The Library's collections include over ten million items in more than 40 languages.

The Toronto Public Library serves residents and communities in ways no other institution can. We empower Torontonians to thrive in the digital age and global knowledge economy through expanded access to technology, lifelong learning and diverse cultural and leisure experiences, online, in our branches and in the community.

The year 2017 was an exemplary year for Toronto Public Library:

- with support from the City of Toronto through the Poverty Reduction Strategy:
 - Sunday service hours were increased by 30 percent. This resulted in increased access to computers, Internet, study and work space, collections and programs in neighbourhoods across the city;
 - the Library created two additional Youth Hubs at Albion and Barbara Frum branches, bringing the total to eight. The Library's Youth Hubs align with and support Toronto's Poverty Reduction Strategy goals to improve access to and support growth in the number of high-quality programs for children and youth;
 - the Wi-Fi hotspot lending program expanded to over 500 devices;
- the Library Board endorsed Indigenous Strategies, with recommended multi-year initiatives approved.
