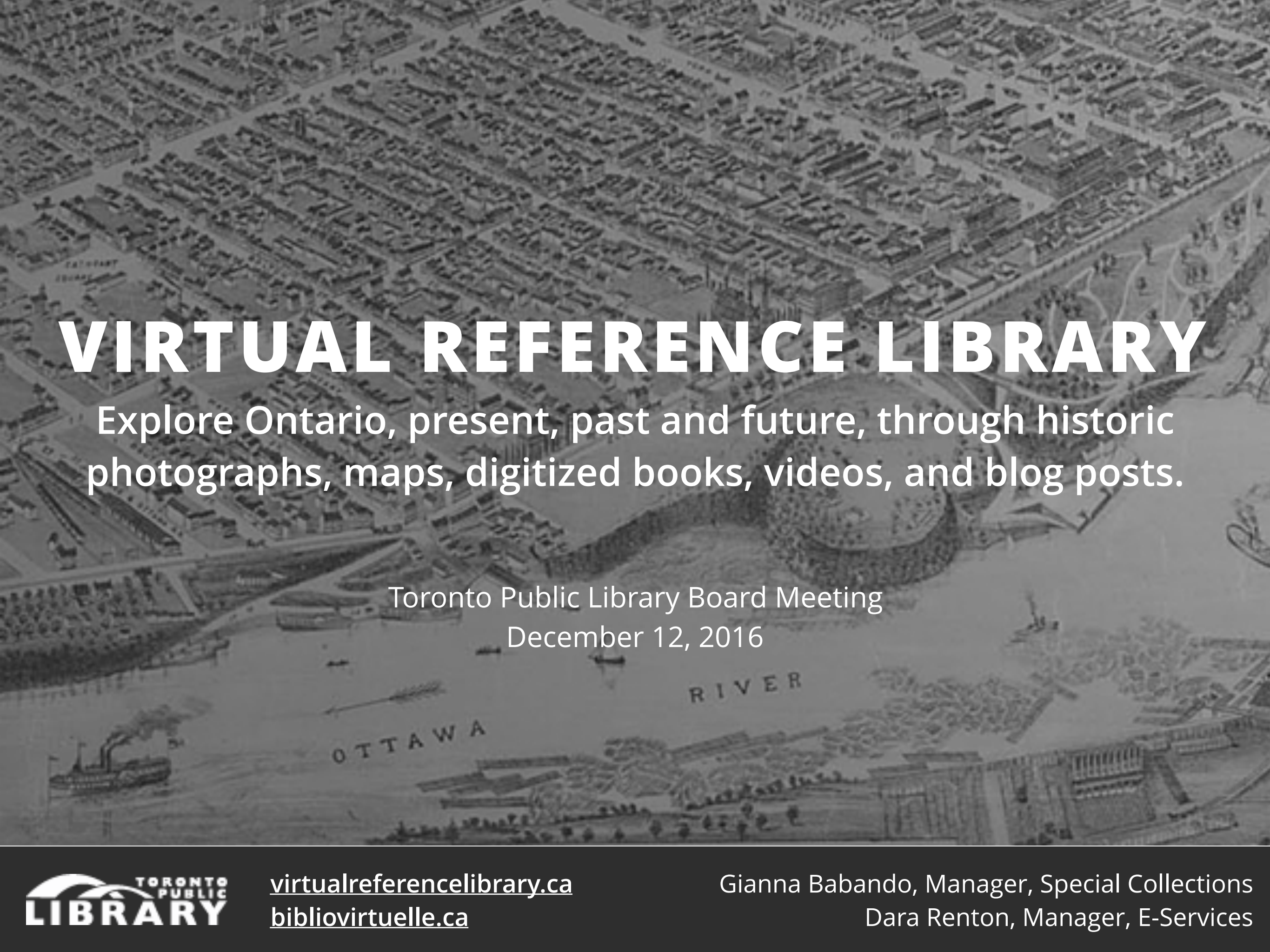

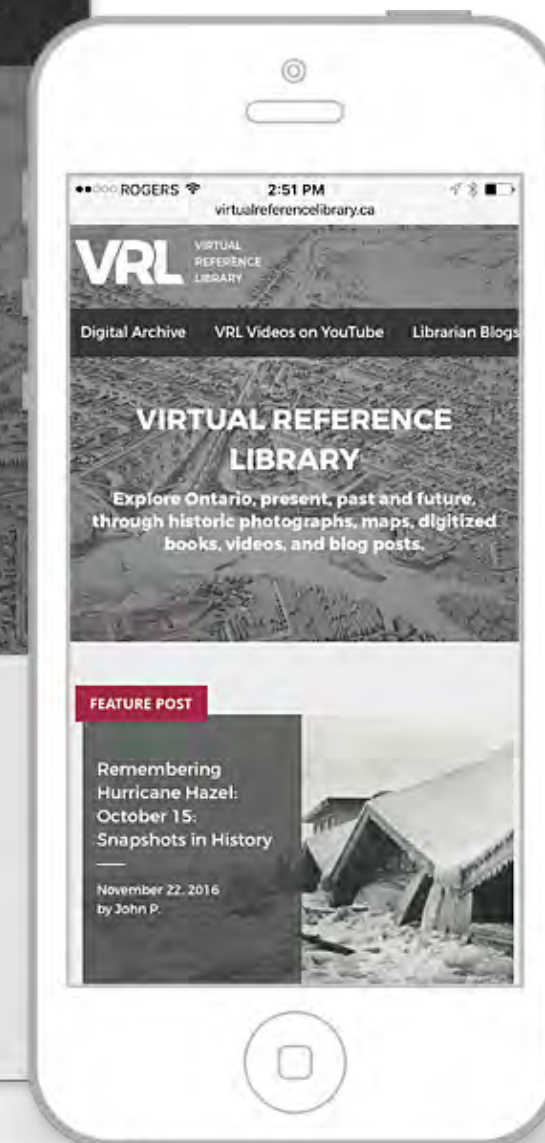

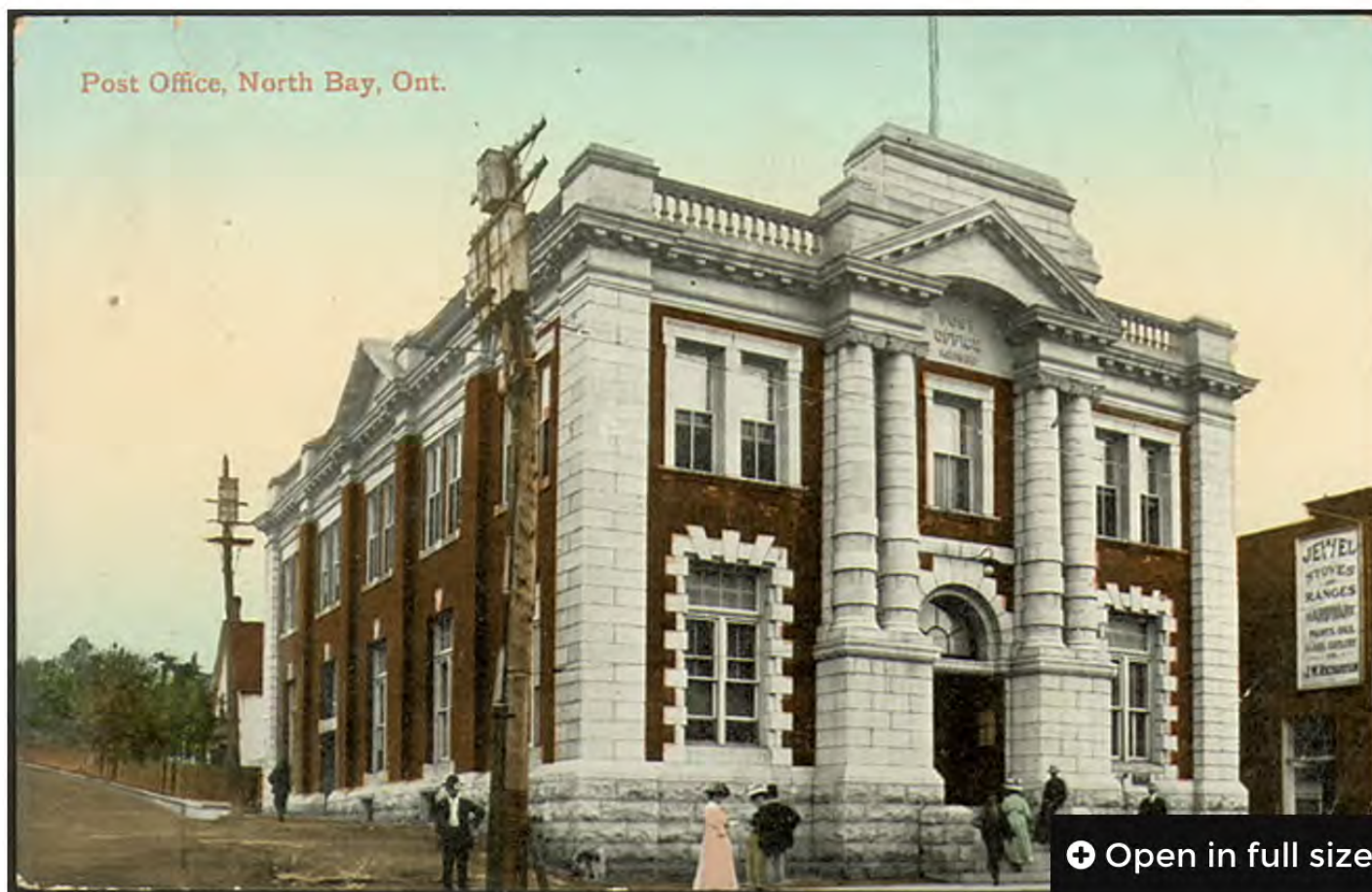

Gaston Tremblay, votre initiation littéraire a commencé avec la poésie. Pourquoi ?

Gaston Tremblay : J'ai commencé à écrire de la poésie très jeune, à l'âge de treize ans. Mon père est mort en 1958, et ma mère a placé les trois plus vieux de ses huit enfants dans des pensionnats. Donc, en 1962 j'entrais en Élément latin au Collège du Sacré-Cœur de Sudbury. J'étais beaucoup trop jeune, j'ai eu beaucoup de difficulté à m'adapter au régime de vie des pensionnaires.

Un soir d'automne, étant extrêmement triste, je marchais sous un ciel étoilé devant le collège... entre les grands ormes qui longeaient l'allée qui s'ouvrait ostensiblement sur la rue Notre-Dame. J'étais en détresse, je ne comprenais pas pourquoi ma mère m'avait « renvoyé » de la maison. C'est dans la noirceur, entre ciel et terre, que la poésie m'a soufflé à l'oreille mon premier poème : un quatrain aussi simple que musical.
