# Services

Community Librarians on-site at Toronto Seniors Housing (TSHC) offer the following services:

- Digital literacy education and support, including the Digital Literacy & Equipment Distribution Program, one-on-one appointments (Book a Librarian) and more
- Library card registrations and account support
- Overview and connection to TPL branch programs and services
- Information services, including support or referral in filling out government forms
- Social or informational programming: discussion groups, health and financial programs, etc.

# Service Planning

Service planning is revised through collaboration and consultation with TSHC staff and tenants to provide localized service that meets the unique needs of residents in each building.

# TPL Programs, Events & Activities

## 2022 Programs (April to December)

- 160 programs
- 1,447 participants
- Includes SDL 6-week programs, focus groups, drop-in tech help, mindful colouring

## 2022 Events & Activities

- 34 events
- 834 participants
- 168 new library card registrations

# Book-a-Librarian Sessions

## 2022 Book-a-Librarian sessions (May to December)

- 140 sessions with 149 participants
- Topics included:
  - Smartphone assistance
  - Computer basics
  - Internet skills
  - Accessing government and community resources

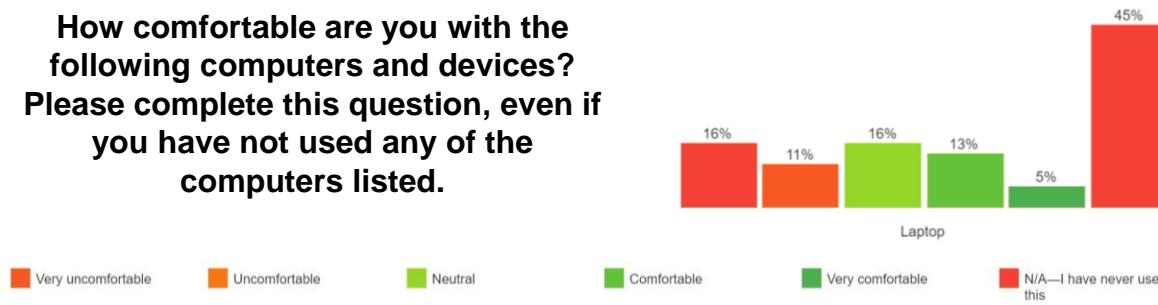

# Pre-Program Survey

Prior to beginning the Seniors Digital Literacy and Equipment Distribution Program 6-week program, **85 seniors** participated in a survey about their comfort level with various devices.

How comfortable are you with the following computers and devices?  
Please complete this question, even if you have not used any of the computers listed.

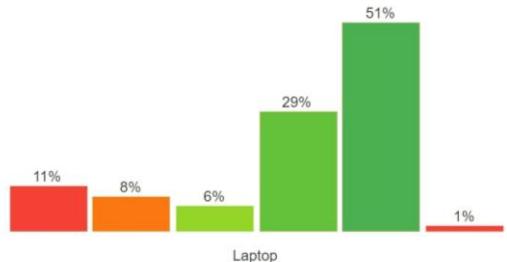


Roughly 47% of the students **had never used a computer** (laptop or desktop), and a further 26% said they were **uncomfortable using one**.

# Post-Program Survey

By comparison to the start of the program, 80% of students who completed the survey said they were **comfortable using a laptop** after completing the course.

# Social Impacts

**Increased social interaction** is one of the aims of the Seniors Digital Literacy program.

94% said they **enjoyed being part of the group**, and 81% said they **intended to keep in touch with other students**.

In a 3-month follow-up interview, 71% said they had followed through with remaining in touch with their peers.
