

## **SUMMARY STATISTICS - Electronic Services**

### **January - December 2002**

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

1. **Virtual Visits.** Count of visits to the library via the Internet. A visit occurs when a user connects to a networked library resource for any length of time or purpose (regardless of the number of pages or elements viewed). Examples of a networked library resource include a library OPAC or a library web page.
- 2 **Database Sessions.** Count of the number of sessions (logins) initiated to online databases.
- 3 **Items Examined.** Count of the number of items retrieved for viewing from TPL-produced web services and licensed Web databases. Includes Web pages, full-text articles, PDF documents, abstracts, citations, non-textual (photos, maps, etc.)
- 4 **Database Queries/Searches.** Count of the number of searches conducted in the library's online databases. Subsequent activities by users (e.g. browsing and printing) are not considered as part of the search process.
- 5 **Virtual Information Requests.** Count of the number of reference and directional questions submitted using the Internet. A question must be received electronically (e.g. via e-mail, WWW form, Virtual Reference Desk). and responded to electronically. Count the number of questions, not the number of requests.
- 6 **Networked CD-ROMs.** Includes CD-ROM products mounted on servers, excluding Children's CD-ROMs.
- 7 **Catalogue** includes Web PAC (remote and in-branch use) and DialPAC (remote use only). Dynix PAC for Windows and staff Dynix are not included.
- 8 **Number of Public Workstations.** Count of the number of library owned public graphical workstations that connect to the Internet, PAC, or CD-ROMs, or have other special purposes (e.g. word processing, Leading to Reading)
- 9 **Number of Public Workstations offering Internet Access.** Count of the number of library owned public access graphical workstations that connect to the Internet for a dedicated purpose (to access an OPAC or specific databases) or multiple purposes.
- 10 **Number of Public Access Workstation Users.** Count of the number of users of all of the library's graphical public access workstations connected to the Internet or CD-ROMs.
- 11 **Number of Electronic Reference Sources.** Total number of licensed vendor web databases, CD-ROM products accessible on public workstations, and TPL produced web services
- 12 **Number of Electronic Reference Sources with Remote Access.** Number of licensed web databases and TPL web services accessible outside the library.
- 13 **Number of Le@rning Centres.** Number of public computer classrooms in the TPL system.
- 14 **Percentage of Remote Library Visits.** Percentage of remote virtual visits to total library visits (virtual plus physical library visits). Exclude in-branch virtual visits.
- 15 **Number of Electronic Full-Text Journals.** Number of licensed electronic full-text journals that provide both search and browse capabilities by title and issue. Does not include journal article databases, such as *Expanded Academic ASAP*, that do not provide browsing capability or general-purpose periodicals such as magazines and newspapers.
- 16 **Number of E-book Titles Available by Subscription.** Count of the number of e-book titles that the library subscribes to and offers to the public.
- 17 **Number of Records in the VRL Database.** Total number of records in the Virtual Reference Library database, covering the VRL and its gateways (excluding Digital Collections).
- 18 **Size of Library Digital Collection.** Number of digitized items created in or converted from non-electronic formats by the library and made available to users electronically.
- 19 **Formal User Information Technology Training Sessions.** Count of the number of structured sessions instructing patrons in the use of information technology or resources obtainable using information technology.
- 20 **Formal User Information Technology Training.** Count of the number of users instructed in the use of information technology or resources obtainable using information technology in structured sessions-either delivered in the library using a computer lab or other instructional settings or delivered electronically through online-based instruction.
