Subject: **2002 – 2006 Revised Capital Budget – EMT Recommended Reductions**

Purpose:

To obtain Toronto Public Library Board approval for the Revised 2002 – 2006 Capital Budget which incorporates the Executive Management Team's (EMT) recommended reductions.

Funding Implications and Impact Statement:

Not applicable.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Toronto Public Library Board approve the revised 2002 – 2006 Capital Budget which shows a gross capital funding commitment of \$11.877 million in 2002 and \$24.165 million in 2002 – 2006.

Background:

At its meeting on October 29, 2001, the Board approved the submission for the Toronto Public Library's 2002 – 2006 Capital Budget.

As part of the review process with the City, the Executive Management Team has recommended that reductions be made to the capital budget funding amounting to \$5.300 million in 2002 and \$20.819 million in 2002 – 2006 in order to meet debt targets. These reductions are as summarized below:

Comment:

The attached 2002 – 2006 Revised Capital Budget details which projects are impacted by the EMT recommendations.

The EMT recommended capital budget for 2002 falls approximately \$3 million short of the City's benchmark spending for building state of good repairs.

Conclusion:

It is recommended that the Board approve the Toronto Public Library's Revised 2002-2006 Capital Budget incorporating the EMT recommended reductions.
