

Dorothy Watkins Collection
(1940 – 1950)
Inventory

Material relating to the career of Canadian composer and performer Dorothy Watkins (1896-1978). Co-author with Brian Doherty of the wartime RCAF hit “Up, Up, Up We Go”, she was active with her sister Jessie MacDonald during World War II in the Active Service Canteen and the Merry-Go-Round Revue. Later she toured with “The Drunkard” and the revues “There Goes Yesterday” and “Clap Hands”. The collection includes correspondence, programmes, clippings, photographs and especially music manuscripts, parts and cues for “The Drunkard” and “There Goes Yesterday”.
